



This is Our First Step to Do it ! A Grant Request

Areas Served: High Crime Low Income Neighborhoods.

Objective: Reduce crime by researching and publicizing, best practices for implementing services, programs, facilities, and opportunities in high crime areas.

Approach: Research what is needed to implement activities and facilities needed in the distressed neighborhoods. Provide research results to local nonprofit organizations, mayors, policy makers, so they may implement the activities and construct facilities with the best chances of success.

Primary Activities and Facilities

1. Activities for youth and others to express themselves such as dance studios, video production, audio editing
Provide equipment that will increase self-esteem, status, and employment opportunities.
2. Provide free seminars and meetings to assist entrepreneurs and the community's needs.
3. Provide assistance to improve social behavior and relationships.
4. Provide Maslow's hierarchy of needs: housing, health, safety, nutrition etc.

Program Status

In Baltimore, we have communicated with the Baltimore Police Department, funding agencies, and local nonprofit organizations. We identified 2 police districts (Northeastern and Western) where most violent crimes are occurring. We now are seeking to identify neighborhoods in the district. Working with the Vacants to Value program we are identifying vacant houses to renovate and house the activities for local youth and other residents.

Scope of Research

Perform worldwide internet research and interviews with persons providing existing services and activities to assess lessons learned and best practices. Priority countries: Norway, Denmark, German, China, Singapore.

Perform feasibility studies following standard templates <https://templatelab.com/feasibility-study/> i.e. :

1. Describe the scope of the project.
2. Identify users of activities and service: their needs, desires, acceptance and support.
3. State requirements of the project
4. Determine what exists now and what has been planned by others.
5. Identify potential partners
6. Identify actions and resource for financial sustainability
7. Identify methods to publicize results to other and implement with limited additional research.
8. Describe options for steps to implement the activities and construct facilities
9. Evaluate the cost effectiveness and metrics for success
10. Identify location for activities and facilities
11. Propose budgets
12. Propose staffing and position descriptions
13. Have the above reviewed by an independent party.
